



YOUR SUPPLIES / DELIVERIES

STORING YOUR SUPPLIES

- » Keep all supplies out of reach of children.
- » Check the label on all medications and solutions for storage instructions.
- » If refrigerated, please keep separate from food and food spills.
- » Refrigerated supplies should be placed in the refrigerator as soon as possible after they arrive.
- » Place the new supplies behind “older dated” supplies you may still have in your refrigerator.
- » Non-refrigerated items should be kept in a cool, dry place away from direct sunlight and above freezing temperatures.
- » Do not store supplies on the floor.
- » Store supplies away from pets and children.

USED CONTAINERS AND SUPPLIES

- » All used drug containers and plastic syringes without needles are to be placed in your household garbage.
- » You will be given a plastic Sharps container. Needles and items that have come in contact with blood are to be placed inside container. **DO NOT SEAL TOP UNTIL FULL.** At the completion of therapy a Community Surgical Infusion Representative will pick up the container.
- » Medication containers and supplies will not be picked up. State and Federal Regulations do not allow a pharmacy to restock a medication once it has been dispensed.
- » A Community Surgical Infusion Representative will pick up reusable equipment such as infusion pumps at the completion of your therapy.

SUPPLY INVENTORY / DELIVERY

- » To ensure that you receive your therapy safely and without interruption, you must have enough supplies on hand. You should know the use of each item and how many you will need. Your nurse will explain the use of each item during the visit.
- » Call the pharmacist if you run out of supplies for any reason, or if any change in your doctor’s orders call for a change in supplies.
- » Never reuse supplies intended for one time use, always call for new supplies when in doubt.
